Launched in 2006 by Générations Futures, PAN Europe member organisation in France, and ACAP - Citizens' Action for Alternative to Pesticides-a group of 170 organizations, Pesticide Action Week has been a powerful force for awareness-raising and action for a pesticide free Europe.
