To: Shareholders of Bayer

Dear Sir or Madam:

In anticipation of Bayer's AGM, we, civil society organisations from both sides of the Atlantic ocean and beyond, are writing to you regarding the company's ongoing lobbying activities, in particular those deployed in the US at the expense of US citizens' rights. In our view, these activities do not live up to Bayer's own Code of Conduct<sup>1</sup>, nor to general principles of corporate responsibility, such as the International Code of Conduct on Pesticide Management<sup>2</sup> and the basic principles of the UN Global Compact<sup>3</sup>.

In 2024, Bayer CEO Bill Anderson stated that in "building a company, (...) a shared sense of integrity and a strong ethical code are absolutely essential" and called upon "everyone in Team Bayer (...) to ensure we're acting with integrity". Mr Anderson also stated that "political advocacy, or lobbying, means participating in democratic processes and formation of public policy by communicating a person's or organisation's interests to politicians and institutions that create policies and regulatory frameworks affecting their areas of activity or business."

However, for at least the past two years and till today, the Europe-based multinational Bayer is waging an intensive lobbying campaign in the US which goes far beyond merely "communicating a person's or organisation's interests to politicians and institutions that create policies and regulatory frameworks". Over the past decade, 181,000 US plaintiffs have filed lawsuits against the company, arguing they were not informed of the dangers of using glyphosate-based Roundup herbicide. Many have won multi-million-dollar and even multi-billion-dollar jury verdicts, and tens of thousands have received settlements from Bayer. But many more trials continue.

Bayer is now responding by lobbying federal and state authorities to block citizens from taking producers to court when they suffer damage to their health after using their toxic products. As reported in the Washington Post, a draft of the US Farm Bill contained a section, "drafted with the aid of Bayer", that would prevent state and local authorities from setting their own standards on pesticide safety warnings.4 This cannot be regarded as "ethical and responsible" behaviour. Laws to this end have been introduced in at least eight

US states5 and are being prepared in more than twenty states. According to Bayer's own figures, in 2023 the company spent 18 million USD on lobbying in the US.

Court documents show that Bayer and Monsanto have long and aggressively fought the science<sup>6</sup> on glyphosate and glyphosate-based herbicides such as Roundup. In an open letter of April last year, Bayer called scientific studies brought forward in the litigations against Roundup "junk science". This includes studies by scientists working independently of pesticide companies, which were reviewed by the International Agency for Research on Cancer (IARC) and led it to classify glyphosate as a probable human carcinogen.

As recently as December 2023, a <u>US National Institutes of Health study</u> reported fresh evidence that glyphosate exposure is associated with oxidative stress in humans, which is known to lead to many diseases, including cancer<sup>7</sup>. In response, an American coalition of farm workers, public health and environmental advocates filed a legal petition with the US Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) demanding they immediately suspend authorization for glyphosate.

In fact, in 2023 Bayer promised to remove glyphosate from Roundup products sold to US consumers – only to make things worse by adding four chemicals, two of them banned in the EU, including diquat dibromide. As reported by Friends of the Earth US, this makes the new Roundup on average 45 times more toxic to human health following long-term, chronic exposures.

Around the world, with its deep pockets, Bayer tries to undermine laws and regulations that should protect the population and the environment and hence serve the general interest, deploying a wide range of lobbying tactics<sup>8</sup>. In Europe, for example, Bayer – along with its lobby group Croplife EU – fought hard to take down the pesticide reduction law, a crucial part of the EU Green Deal.

This is in stark contrast also with what European lawmakers outlined in their Report on the Monsanto Papers. The authors – Members of the European Parliament – stated that we need stronger risk management measures: "The authorisation procedure for plant protection products should remain science-based and rely on independent, transparent and efficient processes" and "studies used for the assessment should be more independent and based on scientific evidence, to avoid conflicts of interests".

Bayer's lobby campaign in the US has now ignited battles in several US farming states between farm groups. In the New Lede and The Guardian, Aaron Lehman, an Iowa corn and soybean farmer, president of the Iowa Farmers Union, said: "We're very worried. Our farmers feel that if they have injuries or illnesses due to their use of a pesticide they should have access to the courts. We just don't think the playing field should be tilted."

Bayer claims that the legislative changes are simply necessary to protect its "important investments" and to ensure farmers don't lose access to Roundup. This is in stark contradiction of its self-declared value of "integrity" and internationally accepted standards.

The aim of Bayer's lobby campaign is simple: to maximise profits and maintain an almost monopolistic control over the commercial seed and pesticides markets.<sup>9</sup> As the US academic Phil Howard wrote, Bayer's commercial strategies are hurting farmers in the US as well: "Agrifood consolidation reduces farmer autonomy and redistributes costs and benefits across the food chain, squeezing farmer incomes".

Simply put: Bayer's miscalculation of its 53 billion euro purchase of Monsanto in 2018 is coming at the expense of consumers, farmers and democracy, with commercial interests blatantly overruling public health and environmental concerns.

In view of the above, we, the undersigned organisations from the US, Europe, and beyond, urge you to make the following demands to Bayer:

- Cease promoting the pesticide makers' legal immunity bills in the US
- Refrain from any further lobbying efforts that are damaging to the public interest
- Stop undermining scientific integrity by attacking independent science and instead, respect the Precautionary Principle.
