Bayer has officially entered our court case against the renewal of glyphosate. We need your support to stand up to this chemical giant. A coalition of 139 civil society, scientific, water, and farming organisations across Europe have called on von der Leyen to fully enforce the EU Pesticide legislation. The General Court of the EU clarified in a judgment that EU Member States are required to demand toxicity data for co-formulants used in pesticides. The European Commission's Vision for Agriculture and Food proposes easing market access for biological control substances (biocontrol), but this comes with a dangerous catch. And much more.


Bayer joins Commission to defend glyphosate in EU Court - Support us

EU Court rules that Member States must fully assess toxicity of co-

We lost a court case, but the good part is that the General Court of the EU clarified that EU Member States are required to demand toxicity data for coformulants used in pesticides. The absence of such data in the pesticide industry applications must inevitably lead to a rejection of the request and a suspension of the national authorisation. Read more

PAN Netherlands has filed an urgent appeal with the Trade and Industry Appeals Tribunal (CBb) to ban the use of the pesticide Pitcher in the open air. The scientific evidence of damage to health is convincing: it contains an
