Criminal Complaint Against Bayer for Concealing Glyphosate Risks to Pregnant Women

In a <u>submission</u> made to the Vienna Public Prosecutor's Office, GLOBAL 2000 and other member organisations of the European Pesticide Action Network (PAN) revealed that the <u>consortium</u> led by Bayer - like Monsanto before it - failed to submit unfavourable studies and/or data on the carcinogenic and neurotoxic effects of glyphosate in the application for re-approval of glyphosate. <u>Read more</u>.

Expert meeting shows that glyphosate is not safe for health and environment

Genotoxicity, carcinogenicity, damage to the gut microbiome and endocrine disruption by glyphosate and glyphosate-based products have been given little importance in the safety assessment by ECHA and EFSA. The same is the case for harmful effects on soil, water and biodiversity. This was highlighted during a meeting with several scientific

Glyphosate in the EU up to 2034? Danger to health and environment and violation of citizens will

The EU Commission proposes to renew the authorisation for the herbicide glyphosate for 10 years. If a qualified majority of Member States agree, glyphosate use in the EU would be allowed until 2033. This would be in stark contrast to the will of the Europeans. Five years ago 1 Million citizens formally asked for a ban and a recent

IPSOS opinion poll in 6 EU countries shows that only a mere 14% of citizens agree with prolonged use. Meanwhile, there are serious concerns about the safety assessments by EU Chemical Authority ECHA and Food Safety Authority EFSA. <u>Read more</u>.

Negative effect of pesticide exposure for farmers and farm workers


Negative effect of pesticide exposure for farmers and farm workers

From tank preparation to pesticide mixing and spraying, farmers' work can expose them to high volumes of chemicals. This working environment threatens their health. Pesticides can lead to cancer or neurological diseases like Parkinson's. One of the solutions promoted to reduce exposure is personal protective equipment, but its efficiency is now subject to heated debate in the scientific community. Swimming in glyphosate: Analysis of official glyphosate and AMPA data in Spanish waters in 2021 and 2022



As Spain is about to vote on whether to confront its population and nature with another 10 years of glyphosate (active substance of herbicides such as

Roundup), the official analyses of Spanish water bodies speak clearly: in 2022, 34.6% of Spanish surface waters were contaminated by glyphosate in a concentration that does not comply with the environmental quality standard. <u>Read more</u>.
