#### We need effective buffer zones against a cloud of pesticides

A hot topic in pesticide use: how to protect citizens, water and nature from the spread of these toxic chemicals? If pesticides are allowed, what minimum buffer zone should be applied? The recent proposal from the European Commission for pesticide reduction (SUR) says 3 metres for sensitive areas. This is far from enough. Read more.

#### From toxic 12 to 10? EU Commission finally plans to ban some very toxic pesticides

The EU Commission is proposing to ban two fungicides and one insecticide due to their high toxicity to human health and the environment. Good news but it took far too long. Dimoxystrobin and Oxamyl should have been banned in 2016 and Ipconazole in 2018. Read more.





## Lower residue limits for pesticides in food to protect pollinators

The EU Commission adopted new rules to lower the Maximum Residues Levels (MRLs) of bee killer pesticides clothianidin and thiamethoxam in imported food. This follows their ban since 2018 on their outdoor use. Read more.

## Pesticide debate in EU Parliament - Save Bees and Farmers

Rapporteur Sarah Wiener delivered her report at the EU Parliament. She proposes more ambition with an 80% reduction for the most toxic pesticides in 2030, larger buffer zones and many other improvements. The report will be the basis for further debate, while the intensive agriculture lobby is trying to delay any step towards more sustainable agriculture. Read more.

#### Belgian Flemish region challenged in court for better protection against pesticides

Environmental and nature organisations sue the Flemish

government in court over its pesticide policy. Nature should be better protected, as well as schools and rest homes. The case started on February 6 before the Brussels court. If the Flemish government is proved wrong, it must amend the regulations, otherwise, penalty payments will follow. Read more.

## **PAN Netherlands wants more organic products in supermarkets** PAN UK has been <u>ranking supermarkets</u> on pesticide reduction

targets for a number of years. Inspired by this, PAN Netherlands reviewed organic products in supermarkets. Here ALDI is the least sustainable, with Albert Heijn in the lead. However, the market share of organic products in supermarkets is stuck at a very low 3.3%. They urge the government to introduce regulations to promote growth and sales of organic products.
